## Rhynie CFS Farewell



The Rhynie Community mourns the passing of our CFS Captain of over 28 years. Neil has been a member of the Rhynie CFS for 41 years, becoming Captain in 1995, and served as Gilbert Group Equipment Coordinator for the past 12 years. He was well respected by his Brigade members, his peers in Gilbert Group and Region 2, as well as his community. Apart from attending to his duties as Captain, such as fires, road crashes, fallen trees, flooding etc., he also gave his time to many community projects. Neil was instrumental in organizing numerous projects to upgrade the Rhynie CFS Station, all of which were funded by the members of the brigade through event catering and equipment hire. Neil was a keen follower of country music, attending many concerts and music festivals across the state. He also organized several fund-raising concerts in the station, which all went to fund these upgrades.

Neil was a quiet, unassuming man who just got on with the job, despite the roadblocks. His battle with cancer has been a long one, but he was always positive, never complaining or let you know how bad he felt. I would always ask, "How are you going Neil?" and his standard reply was, "Ah, yeh OK," but I always knew that meant he was struggling. He just pushed on regardless, doing what he could at the station, at Group or Region meetings, at incidents, and at home. His strength of character, positive attitude, devotion to the CFS and Rhynie Brigade, as well as his community, have been and always will be an inspiration to me, and no doubt to many others. He is sadly missed by us all.

These sales only go to prove how much so many people love the Lions Christmas cakes.

This year we shall have our usual 1.5 kg Christmas Cake for \$20, a 1 kg Christmas Cake for \$16, a 900 gm Christmas Pudding \$16 and 80gm pre wrapped cakes for \$2 each. Redevelopment and construction work in excess of \$3.5M is now well underway by Juncken Builders at the Walara Gilbert Valley site. Construction of 2 temporary rooms is expected to be completed in the next few weeks and internal demolition (including asbestos removal) of the 5 rooms in Stage 1 has also commenced. Fire systems are progressively being updated and a new nurse call bell system has been installed.

Concrete has been poured in the ensuites of the two temporary rooms as per attached photo and gyprocking of bathrooms is now underway. Once completed these rooms will provide for new larger facilities including user friendly new ensuites.



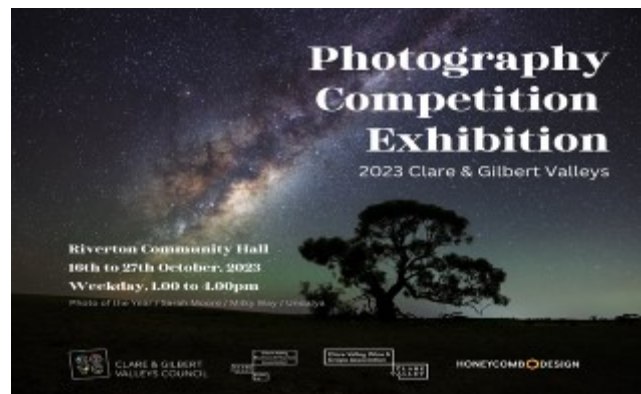
Board Chair, Malcolm May, and local Board Member, Matthew Greenslade, said how excited they were that this work is now well underway which can be seen by the community.
