

Well – after a lengthy time of organisation and funding acquisition, our Digital Noticeboard is up and functioning on the front wall of the Riverton Post Office. There were a few hiccups in installation over Christmas but thanks to the installer and Sam Goodfellow from SGE Solar, it is now up and running.

This project has been a major focus for our Committee for some time. Commencing in 2021, a survey was implemented and forwarded by email to our TLR subscribers and also made available to the community in hard copy to obtain feedback on the support

that this initiative would engender. We received over 90 replies to this survey and the percentage of these replies that supported the initiative was an overwhelming 98%. This set us on the path to acquire funding to make this very important communication tool a reality.



To undertake any major initiatives, the Riverton Community Management Committee relies on grants to support anything that we wish to brina realisation. Communication to residents is of the utmost importance and also the most difficult to accomplish. We have now been able to instal this wonderful initiative which will be such a boost to our communication method in our town. We will be able to promote events, advertise community information, appropriate bushfire information and much more valuable informational data which is difficult to disseminate throughout our town adequately and has been one area in which we have wanted improvement for quite a long time.

Since the last update there has been significant progress with redevelopments Hamley the Walara Bridge redevelopment now complete and the official opening scheduled for 12 April 2024. At Walara Gilbert Valley progress on the \$5.9M redevelopment also continues to be positive with the 5 rooms being renovated expected to be completed at the end of this month, see the latest photos below.



Stage 2 work commences early April 2024 and community members driving past the facility will see that the shrubs and bushes have been removed to the left of the current entrance in readiness for the work to start on the 4 new rooms.
